

back Tuesday Night Blues. The City also expanded the footprint of the Tree Lighting and Mayor's Sing-Along by bringing in the Maker's Boulevard as Santa's Village.

The City facilitated 97 special events this calendar year, of which 85 came to fruition, and the other thirteen cancelled for external reasons such as weather. The remaining 85 events included permitted events, co-sponsored events and fully produced City events. In addition to these, the City's long-standing partnership with the Pacific Coast Farmers Market Association resulted in an additional 52 events, which is a total of 137 event days that the City of Concord provided to the community this year, driving thousands of residents and consumers to experience the City of Concord.

Public Safety

- **Local Roadway Safety Plan.** City staff, in collaboration with the Mt. Diablo School District and County Connection, prepared a Local Roadway Safety Plan. The LRSP provides the City with a framework to evaluate collision hotspots, identify safety countermeasures, and monitor progress toward reducing and ultimately eliminating serious injuries and deaths (sometimes called a vision zero plan).
- **Pine Hollow Road Complete Street Feasibility Study.** Successfully completed a number of outreach events to get feedback from the community on the future vision for the Pine Hollow Road corridor. The study identified, evaluated, and recommended a comprehensive package of multimodal and operational strategies to enhance bicycle and pedestrian safety, residential and school access, access to transit, and trail connectivity for all users. Staff is proactively seeking funding to complete design and construct improvements.
- **Portable Speed Feedback Signs.** Installed 3 portable speed feedback signs and covert device to address speeding concerns from the residents as a part of the citywide neighborhood traffic calming program.
- **Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) Program.** The Concord Police Department's UAS/Drone Team is fully operational. The team currently consists of 11 Part 107 certified pilots, overseen by one Part 107 certified pilot Sergeant. Our drone fleet includes (3) Autel Evo II's, (2) Brinc Lemurs, (2) Loki II's and (1) Tink Hawk 3 (a practice drone). All of our pilots have been through basic, advanced and night flight trainings. A majority of the team has also participated in a week-long training session on the use of the Brinc Lemur. The team has flown 128 law enforcement missions and 20 search and rescue missions. All non-training missions are listed on the City website.
- **Flock Citywide LPR Camera Program.** Identified 65 viable sites where cameras will be installed citywide, will have approximately ½ of their cameras up over the next few months.
- **Peregrine Software Support System.** Implemented this new software system which facilitates researching PD records efficiently.
